Dr. Wade Davis to Headline the KWIC World Issues November 23rd Café

"A rare combination of scientist, scholar, poet and passionate defender of all of life's diversity." David Suzuki

Canadian National Geographic explorer, renowned anthropologist and ethnographer, photographer, filmmaker and prolific author, Wade Davis has been described by CBC as a 'Renaissance Man'. Having penned over 40 books, Davis is often recognized for the 1985 novel, *The Serpent and the Rainbow*, documenting his early work in Haiti. In 2009, *The Wayfinders* earned him the honour of CBC Massey Lecturer, and his latest novel, *Into the Silence: The Great War, Malloy and the Conquest of Everest* was recently recognized and honoured in the U.K. for a non-fiction award. Davis won the Samuel Johnson Prize on November 12, 2012.

Davis's inaugural Peterborough visit has been organized by the Kawartha World Issues Centre in partnership with The David Sheperd Lecture Series at Trent University. A morning youth engagement presentation with Davis will be hosted by Lakefield College School for high school groups, entitled **Exploring Our Limits: Youth, Adventure and Environment**. A private behind-the-scenes tour of the Canadian Canoe Museum will precede a welcoming reception catered by Shawn Adler (formerly of Asamabik's and LUNCH), followed by the KWIC World Issues Café presentation, **The Sacred Headwaters and the Fight to Save the Stikine, Skeena, and Nass,** at PCVS Auditorium.

The **Sacred Headwaters** talk will illustrate the beauty, cultural significance and national importance of The Sacred Headwaters in British Columbia. The area has been opened up for development by the B. C. government against the wishes of the First Nations and local communities who call this land home, as well as supporters from the international community. The increasing appropriation of land for development and resource extraction by governments and large mining companies is a complex issue impacting communities around the world.

Davis's November 23rd Peterborough talk is timely: three of the most important salmon rivers in BC will be affected if a 2008 moratorium currently restraining SHELL from fracking for coalbed methane in the Headwaters is lifted on December 8th, 2012. Coalbed methane could forever transform the wild salmon ecosystems upon which jobs, cultures, and traditions have been built in the region. The Skeena River's wild salmon economy - valued at \$110 million annually - is an important source of livelihood for the local communities.
