



## <u>FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE:</u> Community Forum Prioritizes Indigenous Leadership in the Sustainable Development Goals

<u>Peterborough ON</u> (February 8th, 2021) Have you imagined a world in which we all have what we need to live a good life without compromising the future of our species and planet?

**Kawartha World Issues Centre** and **GreenUP** invite you to a free virtual community forum on February 24<sup>th</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup> entitled, *Centering Indigenous Leadership and Diverse Perspectives to Advance the Sustainable Development Goals in Nogojiwanong/Peterborough.* 

This event builds on the collective work of over 100 community members on five local priority Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs): SDG #1 No Poverty, SDG # 4 Quality Education, SDG #6 Clean Water and Sanitation, SDG #13 Climate Action, and Prioritizing Indigenous Leadership.

Unanimously adopted by world leaders at a historic United Nations summit in September 2015, the SDGs are an urgent call for action by all countries - developed and developing - in a global partnership. The goals recognize that ending poverty must be aligned with strategies that improve health and education, reduce inequality, and spur economic growth – all while tackling climate change and working to preserve our oceans and forests.

Leaving No One Behind (LNOB) is a collective commitment to combat discrimination, rising inequalities, and their root causes within and amongst countries.


